


Extended DISC® Behavioural Assessment Tool

What is Extended DISC?

DISC is a behavioural self-assessment that measures how an individual prefers to interact with others at work. DISC creates a common language and a self-awareness to better understand ourselves and others. The online DISC questionnaire takes only 10 minutes to complete. The assessment reports are user-friendly and easy to administer. They can be a powerful tool in a wide range of applications such as team building, recruitment, learning and development and career planning.

The DISC model divides people into four main behavioural styles. Individuals are identified as either more People-oriented or Task-oriented. They are further distinguished on a continuum as either more Introverted or Extroverted.



Individual Behavioural Assessments:

Extended DISC Behavioural Assessments help us to understand how we behave and explain how we react spontaneously when we don't have time to consider consequences. The reports are also useful to the individual when considering career choices, in dealing with communication challenges or helping them to understand why certain situations might put them under pressure. They provide a self-awareness that is vital for success at work, and useful in life generally.

These reports also provide information on an individual's behavioural style, such as:

- o Their natural unconscious style compared to their adjusted work style
- What motivates them and situations that reduce motivation
- Clear natural strengths and their development areas
- o Flexibility and comfort zones
- How an individual is typically seen by others
- o Their preferred communication style & communicating emotions
- Their role within a team
- o Their behavioural style against standard competencies
