

Why I will be vaccinated

It is because there was unprecedented co-operation between countries and scientists, significant investment, and the vaccines were under development before COVID-19 because of the SARS and MERS epidemics.
- No amount of google research I do will match the expertise, qualifications and experience of actual scientists. I'm happy to be guided by the science.
- The vaccine is not a small dose of COVID-19 that isn't how it works.
